PRE-EVENT TOURS



These will take place during the week prior to the 50th Weekend; starting from Cape Reinga (Fri 14 April), Bluff (Sun 16 April), Cape Egmont (Mon 17 April) and East Cape (Sun 16 April). The three North Island tours will come together in Ohakune for a combined run on to Whanganui and Masterton. The South Island tour will pick up with our Wellington team for the run up to Masterton.

If you can't do it all, you have the opportunity to join in for part only of these tours as appropriate.

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The **NORTHERNERS** will gather in Taipa Bay for a run up to Cape Reinga and then work their way down to Ohakune. In between, the Bay of Islands beckons, as does the Hokianga, stopping at Omapere. They will stop off at Orewa en route to Tauranga, thence onwards through Rotorua and Taupo.

Cape Egmont is the start for the **WESTERNERS**, travelling up the Forgotten World Highway, heading for Ohakune via Taupo. Take your passports as you stop off at the Republic of Whangamomona—is the President still a poodle?

For the intrepid **EASTERNERS**, there is the magnificent run from East Cape down the coast to Gisborne, with the equally spectacular run on through Napier and up to Taupo.

Not to forget the hardy **SOUTHERNERS**, who head to Bluff for their start. The Catlins Highway is the first highlight, heading for Dunedin. Then on to the lovely Geraldine, with a break at Oamaru to soak up the stonework. Christchurch is an opportunity to catch up with other members before heading on via the Inland Road and the Kaikoura Coast to Picton and a ferry.

If you can't do the Tour, join us at our stopover points, where we will all be together for happy hours and meals. Specific dinner stops have been set up in Dunedin (17 April), Christchurch (19 April), Auckland (Orewa) (17 April) and Whanganui (20 April) as well as the final Wellington Club dinner (26 April). • join the service at the ANZAC Bridge Kaipororo - 20km's north of the Pukaha Mount Bruce Bird Sanctuary at 2:00pm. This will be too late for our visits to Manfield or the Coach House – so a 'on-your-own' visit will work.

We then head over the Pahiatua Track to either

Manfield Autocourse, Feilding where a light lunch will be provided, or; The Coach House in Feilding where a light lunch is available. Dinner and overnight in Palmerston North.
