SOUTHERN TOUR – For those heading northwards

Note: Southern Tour participants will make their own accommodation bookings for the South Island leg. Refer to Murray on 021 311 335 for details.

Monday April 17 – Our formal tour commencement is mid-morning at Stirling Point SH1 at Bluff as the Southern Tour starting Point. We will there assemble for a photo-op. Then we drive via the Catlins, with lunch at Curio Bay, onto to for a 'gathering of the clans' in Dunedin. Overnight in Dunedin.

Tuesday April 18 – We head off on a driving tour from Dunedin to Geraldine. Overnight in Geraldine.

Wednesday April 19 - The touring continues from Geraldine to Christchurch. Southern Tour Dinner in Christchurch – an ideal opportunity for those Southerners who can't make the whole tour to join in the fun. Overnight in Christchurch.

Thursday April 20 – Now we are off on the run up to Picton. Overnight in Picton.

Friday April 21 – We are on the Bluebridge 7:45am sailing to Wellington (so an early 6.45am check-in). Once in Wellington we will be met by some Central members for a short drive through the Capital city, and then head north to Masterton over the Remutaka Hill road.

Friday April 14 – We assemble at the Taipa Beach Resort at Taipa in the evening for drinks and a casual dinner. Overnight at the **Taipa Beach Resort** at Taipa.

Saturday April 15 – We do an up-and-back run to Cape Reinga today. The formal tour commencement is at the Cape Reinga SH1 carpark as the Northern Tour starting point. We will

assemble there for a photo-op. Then we return to Taipa, perhaps with a side trip to Kaitaia and Ahipara, for a casual dinner.

Overnight at the **Taipa Beach Resort** at Taipa.

Sunday April 16 – We have a slow day touring round the far north - Taipa-Kerikeri-Okaihau-Mangamuka-Kohukohu-the ferry-Rawene-Omapere. We are invited to morning tea with Adrian Garrett at the Carriage House in Kerikeri. In the evening you can have a burger at the Opononi pub or dinner at The Heads

Overnight at **The Heads** in Omapere.

Monday April 17 – We make a run down to Orewa visiting Tane Mahuta-Dargaville-Matakohe (Kauri Museum)-Wellsford-Warkworth and hopefully onto the new motorway extension to Orewa.

Here we will have the **Northern Tour Dinner** – a BBQ at the Northridge Lodge – an ideal opportunity for those Northerners who can't make the whole tour to join in the fun.

Overnight at the **Northridge Lodge** at Wainui.

Tuesday April 18 – We whizz through Auckland after the morning rush-hour (picking up Aucklanders at BP Drury on the way) and on to a **Tour Dinner** at The Trinity Wharf in Tauranga.

Overnight at the **Trinity Wharf** in Tauranga.

Wednesday April 19 – Our Northern Tour team will meet up with the Central Region members who will have travelled from East Cape and Cape Egmont in Taupo for lunch. We will then travel on to Ohakune for a **Central Tour Dinner** at the Powderhorn.

Overnight at the **Powderhorn** in Ohakune.

Thursday April 20 – We are off-the-beaten-track – heading down the River Road to Whanganui. We have arranged couple of excursions you can choose from - either;

1. Take a **jet boat** trip from Pipiriki to The Bridge to Nowhere (this does involve a walk), or;
2. Continue on to Whanganui for lunch on the **paddle steamer** Waimarie.

We will meet in the evening for a **Tour dinner** at The Avenue in Whanganui.

Friday April 21 – We are up and away to Masterton - via the Saddle Road through Woodville with lunch at the Tui Brewery in Mangatainoka. There is an option to stop at Pukaha Mount Bruce Bird Sanctuary, SH2 for coffee and a walking tour.

Friday April 21 Evening - We all gather for a Welcome Evening at the Copthorne Solway Park in Masterton. We'll have meet and greet drinks, then our **50th Welcome Dinner** with a mix and mingle game (to get to know each other better) over dinner.

Overnight at the **Solway** in Masterton.

Saturday April 22 – We travel to Greytown for the 'Great Greytown Explorer'.

We will take a relaxing back roads tour to Greytown where there is plenty to see and do - most within easy walking distance. It is pretty much free time in one of NZ's most beautiful towns. There are plenty of cafes and eateries available for casual lunch, and some shopping! Then we take different back roads on the return to Masterton.

In the evening, we bus from the Solway to the Kittyhawk Café at Hood Aerodrome for our 1970's themed dress-up **50th Anniversary Dinner**. Return by bus to Solway.

Overnight at the **Solway** in Masterton.

Sunday April 23 – In the morning it is time to wash and wax for the Concours d' Elegance display and judging.

We then drive to Martinborough for a **light catered lunch** at the historic Martinborough Town Hall, with wine tasting options. Afternoon is a casual drive (via an easy navigational run with other places of interest en-route) back to the Solway for the National AGM leading into pre-dinner drinks and then our **Black Tie Gala Dinner**. Our guest speaker is Scott Thompson - 'Rolls Royce - the myth and the magic'.

Overnight at the **Solway** in Masterton.

Monday April 24 - We have two options:

1. **Bus tours** going to various places of interest – depending on numbers, we are planning to go to Brancepeth historic house, Tirohana Estate for lunch, Stonehenge Aotearoa, or;
2. Convoy / selfdrive to the south coast (Cape Palliser / Ngawi).

We return to the Solway for a **Tour dinner**. Our guest speaker is John Kennedy.

Overnight at the **Solway** in Masterton.

Tuesday April 25 - ANZAC Day. There will be a number of options;

1. A dawn parade at the Masterton War Memorial Hall at 5:30am with a memorial service at the Cenataph in Queen Elizabeth Park at 5:55am;
2. A memorial service at Tinui Church (en route to Castle Point) commencing at 10:00am, or;
3. Join the service at the ANZAC Bridge Kaipororo - 20km's north of the Pukaha Mount Bruce Bird Sanctuary at 2:00pm. (This will be too late for our visits to Manfield or the Coach House – so is a 'on-your-own' visit including getting your own lunch.

We head over the Pahiatua Track to either;

1. A visit to **Manfield Autocourse** in Feilding where we will be met by TrackDaysNZ who will coach us through some high-speed runs in our cars behind a pace car or, for the more aggressive, some individual Hot Laps. For the more passive, there is a passenger/spectator option. A light **lunch** will be provided, or;
2. A visit to The **Coach House** in Feilding where a light lunch is available.

Then on to a **Tour Dinner** at the Coachman in Palmerston North

Overnight at the **Coachman** in Palmerston North.

Wednesday April 26 - There are two options;

1. We travel to Ohakea air base for a Biggin Hill aircraft museum visit - possibly including the helicopter repair / maintenance facility (the NZ Air Force helicopters are fitted with Rolls Royce jet engines), or;
2. We go to the Gables Museum and Gardens and Awahuri.

Then we will lunch at the adjacent Woolshed Café before heading south to Southwards Car Museum at Paraparaumu and on into Wellington.

Our **Farewell Dinner** will be at the prestigious Wellington Club - Sir Neville Jordan is our guest speaker - 'Peking to Paris - trials and tribulations'.

Overnight at the **James Cook Hotel** in Wellington.
